A Message From Revd Gareth...

I am delighted to have been chosen as Rector of such a wonderful community. I am not moving here alone though as I am accompanied by my wife Jenna, our three children Elijah, Phoebe and Nathaniel, and our dog Izzy. The warmth of welcome the family and I have received from you since we moved in has been amazing and we thank you for your love, prayers and support.

I thought I would share a little of my background as I begin ministry here. I guess the first thing to say is that I am no stranger to Berkshire. For around 15 years I lived in Woodley, attended Waingels Copse Comprehensive (now Waingels College) and worshipped as a chorister at St Pauls, Wokingham.

My links to the area go back further as my ancestors have lived in the area for centuries. In fact Eliza and Ellen, who are ancestors of mine, lived in Easthampstead in the turn of the 19th and 20th Century and are buried in the churchyard of this very Church.

Prior to ordination I was a Police Officer for many years working in various departments in Aylesbury, Waddesdon, Amersham, and Oxford City. It was during this time I met my wife Jenna, who works as a midwife, and it was whilst we were living in Aylesbury that we welcomed our first child Elijah. I was selected for training to ministry and attended St Mellitus Theological College in Kensington, London. The college is part of Durham University and it was there whilst working part time in St Marys, Beaconsfield that I completed a BA degree in theology, ministry and mission. Whilst we were in Beaconsfield we welcomed my second child Phoebe to the family. I then began a three year curacy in High Wycombe where I also with the South Central Theological Education Institute, also affiliated to Durham University, completed a Post Graduate Diploma. I will be graduating later this year and will most likely be visiting Durham in January for a graduation ceremony. All whilst welcoming our third child Nathaniel.

There is of course more to my story which I am looking forward to sharing with you, as I look forward to learning of your story. I also look forward to learning more of where God has been at work here in the past, where he is still at work, and discerning together what he is calling us to do next as a community.

Revd Gareth will be with us at Church @ the Pines on Sunday 10th September, hopefully leading a service of Communion.

Readings

Matthew 16:21-28

Jesus predicts his death

21 From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.

22 Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. 'Never, Lord!' he said. 'This shall never happen to you!'

23 Jesus turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling-block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns.'

24 Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. 25 For whoever wants to save their life[a] will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it. 26 What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? 27 For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with his angels, and then he will reward each person according to what they have done.

28 'Truly I tell you, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom.'

Romans 12:9-21

Love in action

9 Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. 10 Be devoted to one another in love. Honour one another above yourselves. 11 Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervour, serving the Lord. 12 Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. 13 Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practise hospitality.

14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. 15 Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn. 16 Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position. Do not be conceited.

17 Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone. 18 If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. 19 Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: 'It is mine to avenge; I will repay,' says the Lord.

20 On the contrary:

'If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head.'

21 Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.
